Synthesizing Research Projects

I am SO proud of the hard work my students put into completing their first ever research projects last week! Students worked with a partner to select their research topic. Then, they

documented their background knowledge and new learning throughout their research. Some students used books, others magazines, and a few even interviewed an expert. After they synthesized all they learned before, during, and after their projects, students created a poster and a google slideshow to share their learning to teach the class. Their presentations were today and they all did a wonderful job! Social Studies:

Rockford Historical Time Lines

Your child should have brought home a Rockford historical time line last week, pointing out some of the key dates in Rockford's history. Ask your child to share the timeline of events with you at home in preparation for our field trip in May! We will be pausing on our Rockford unit for now to focus more of our efforts on our current science unit.

Math: Unit 7 Test Tomorrow

Tomorrow your child will be taking their unit 7 math test. Concepts to review include:

- Measuring to the nearest inch and centimeter
- Selecting appropriate tools and units when measuring objects and distances
- Estimating measurements and selecting appropriate reference items for estimating
- Filling in missing numbers in a number model
- Creating a line plot

Science Activities

We are currently working on our Earth's Land and Water science unit. Last week we focused on what happens when rain falls and/or snow melts on the top of a mountain. We learned that when rain falls, it becomes runoff or groundwater. Then, the runoff flows to become streams which dump into rivers, then lakes, and eventually all water flows downhill and most of it ends up in the ocean. We also talked about how melting snow on the top of the mountain becomes runoff and also can erode mountains as it flows downhill. This week we will focus on the following driving question: What happens when rain falls on flat land?
