

#### Reader's Theater Presentations

After a week of hard work and repeated reading practice, on Friday Last week we worked on describing different 2-D and 3-D shapes students presented their reader's theater projects to the class. and their attributes. Ask your child to describe the following Reader's theater is a great practice for developing fluency. Students were assigned "parts" and practiced reading in voices to match their characters. While practicing with their groups, they took turns reading, just like you would if you were reading a screenplay. On Friday these were presented to the class. Students had fun with this!

#### Writing Poetry Wrap Up

Last week students published their final poetry piece. We worked on editing for sound—paying attention to parts that didn't sound quite right and then revised/changed things to make them sound better. Then, students created a final copy to hang up in the hall that they were proud of. These are now above their lockers—check them out! Students have been working throughout this unit on completing poetry "anthology" books of poems they've been writing. These will be coming home this week. I hope you enjoy their hard work! After spring break we will be kicking off our final unit of the year: informational writing.



#### Science: Earth's Land and Water

Last week we focused on what happens when rain falls on a mixture of sand, soil, rocks, and pebbles. We learned that in all cases water flows down between the particles and is stored as ground water. Water not stored under ground becomes runoff that flows into streams, rivers, lakes, ponds, and oceans.

Later, students became experts on specific bodies of water. They worked in small groups to study each particular group of water and then made a poster to teach the class.

# **Social Studies: Map Skills**



Going along with our study on the history Rockford is the importance of understanding how to read a map! This week we will be focusing on map skillsparticularly how to identify specific objects on a map using a key, how to use cardinal and intermediate directions to compare locations on a map, and we will even create

maps of our own of familiar places (bedroom, neighborhood, etc). We'll finish our map skills unit when we return from spring break!

# **Math: Comparing Shapes**
